



Here in Orange County, as in so many communities around our country, urbanization is rapidly overtaking equestrian areas. Orange County continues to grow, and every piece of vacant and undeveloped land is being earmarked for construction. If we remain silent, we will see the end of existing and future open spaces, trails, stables, and equestrian-zoned residential areas.

In 1996, an organized group of equestrians, the Saddleback Canyon Riders, successfully lobbied the Orange County Board of Supervisors to open 2,100 acres of beautiful wilderness riding in O'Neill Regional Park, to accept 1,100 acres of wilderness park in Tijeras Creek / Chiquitas Ridge areas, and to vote against privatization of our county parks and recreational areas. All of this was accomplished by only 148 members.

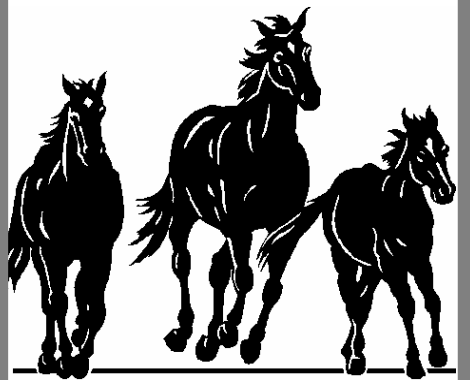
